- Also, in accordance with Clause 36 of the Reabold Tennis Club Constitution, within 14 (fourteen) days following the AGM, the President and the three elected Board Members should appoint three or more Appointed Board Members. Appointed Board Members have a one-year tenure but may be reappointed. Anyone interested in being considered for appointment as an Appointed Board Member should advise the Club Manager prior to Friday 14th August 2026.

League and social tennis continue to enjoy good support, and Total Tennis supports an enthusiastic group of juniors through its junior coaching programs.

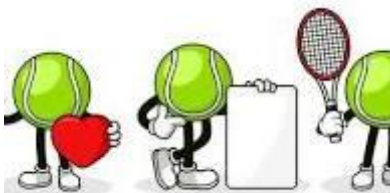
The excellent facilities on the Reabold precinct sees tennis activities and competitions that are complimented by pickleball, Padel, Zumba, choir, social events and various other activities through the hiring of club facilities.

The club again enjoyed a strong financial performance, despite making various investments in programs such as pickleball and various other facility related equipment and services.

On a sad note, we lost our long-time member and Co-Patron, Dr Harry Phillips, during the year. Harry was a highly respected and well-liked member, whose significant contributions to the club were recognised by having a court named in his honour. RIP Harry.

MEMBERSHIP:



Membership numbers have again plateaued, but Reabold continues to enjoy strong member support. However, it remains a challenge to attract younger cohorts as members, given many prefer to hire and play with friends and colleagues. Whilst this helps ensure good court utilisation, it does not enhance the participation in organised social tennis and the number of league teams we can nominate. An area that is currently being addressed is the limited number of juniors being coached at Reabold, who are not joining the club and then playing league. Efforts are being made to introduce organised social tennis for junior members.

Reabold is fortunate to have a strong cohort of members willing to assist the club in a variety of areas. Our thanks to all of them.

FINANCIALS:



The club again enjoyed a strong financial year with an operating profit of approximately **\$12,114**. This exceeded our operating budget by approximately \$9,388. However, our cash balance is approximately \$14,000 below last year due mainly to various capital expenditure costs incurred in relation to equipment and facilities and our contributions to the Town of Cambridge Building Maintenance Fund.

The Reabold Tennis Club's accrued balance in the Town of Cambridge Building Maintenance Fund is \$355,951 as of 30 Jun 26.

Special thanks must again go to Maria LePage for the outstanding work done as chair of our Finance and Administration Committee. Strict monitoring of our finances and the production of timely financial information is greatly appreciated. Our Club Manager, Helen Rocke, manages the day-to-day finances of the club and provides excellent support to Maria.

The Annual Financial Report for 2025/2026 will be distributed separately, together with the Auditor's Report. Thanks to Peter Morrison for again conducting our annual audit.

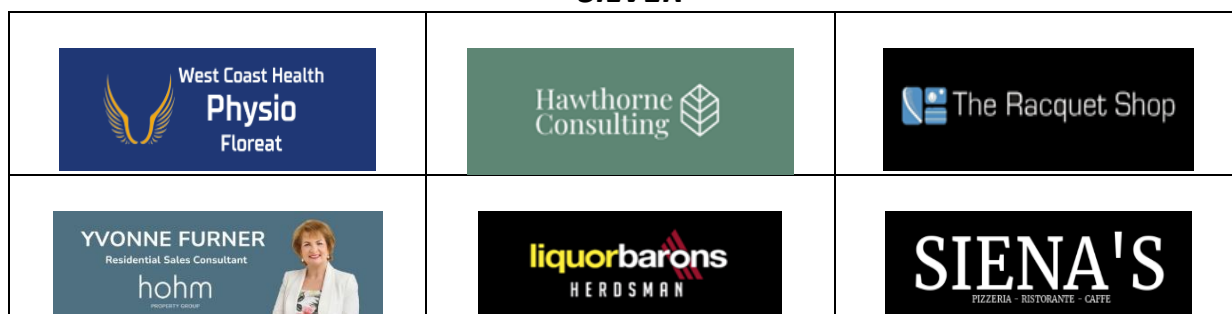

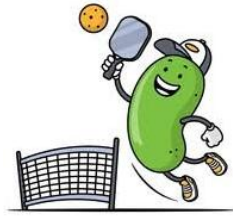
Grass court vertimowing and coring has been completed. Vertimowing improves water absorption by removing dead thatch in the grass and coring improves the air flow and promotes nutrients to penetrate the soil, with the aim being to establish a firm base. Weed spraying will take place once the grass cover is at a satisfactory stage, as determined by the groundsman.

Issues with the grass are being addressed and changes to the watering regime have been introduced. The benefits will become more obvious in the new season, following the closure and maintenance.

Thank you to all those who assisted at the annual busy bee prior to opening day. The few hours of work by volunteers helped prepare the club for the new season.

Thanks again to all the assistance people have given me over the last year, it spreads the load and is appreciated.

PICKLEBALL



Pickleball was introduced at Reabold this year and has been a great success. Its introduction included:

- The establishment of a Board Committee to help manage the introduction and ongoing playing of and participation in pickleball at Reabold. It is chaired by Michael Le Page, who has also become a member of the Australian Pickleball Association.
- Dual markings on four tennis courts to accommodate eight pickleball courts.
- Purchase of nets, bats and balls. The bats and balls are for use at organised social pickleball.
- The introduction of organised social pickleball. This is currently conducted on Thursdays from 9.00am to 10.30am and on Fridays from 6pm to 7.30pm. Many thanks to Michael and Maria Le Page, Tony and Jane Glass, Annette Black, Penny Morrison and Helen Rocke for organising and managing organised social pickleball.

The booking of pickleball courts for casual use will soon be available. The availability will be worked around the tennis requirements and the setting up of nets. Availability will be displayed on the booking system.

Pickleball is one of the world's fastest growing sports and it is now at Reabold. It will add to the vibrancy of our precinct.

PRECINCT UTILISATION:



The vibrancy of the Reabold precinct continues and this year it has been enhanced by the introduction of pickleball. The precinct now includes league and social tennis, tennis coaching and court hire, Padel, pickleball, Zumba, Choir, private events and various functions and other activities through the hire of our club facilities.

TOTAL TENNIS ANNUAL REPORT 2025/26

Total Tennis (TT) is pleased to present its Annual Report for the 2025/26 financial year.

Throughout the year, our focus remained on delivering high-quality coaching while continuing to build clear development pathways for players of all ages and abilities. From ANZ Hot Shots through to Development Squads, High-Performance Squads, Match Play and pennants, our programs continue to provide opportunities for players to develop their skills and enjoy the game.

The year saw continued growth across several areas of the business, including increased online bookings, greater demand for private coaching and a record number of Orange Ball players progressing into Green Ball programs. Our partnerships with local schools also continued to expand, helping introduce more young players to tennis and creating new opportunities to join Total Tennis.

From Hot shots to state grade champions

One of the most rewarding achievements this year was the success of our **Boys State Grade** team, who completed the season **undefeated** before being crowned **2025/26 State Grade Premiers**.

Many of these players first joined Total Tennis through our Red Ball Hot Shots program and have progressed through every stage of our coaching pathway. Several have represented **Western Australia** in interstate junior competitions and are now valued members of the Total Tennis coaching team.

Watching players develop from beginners into State Grade premiers before returning to coach the next generation is something we are incredibly proud of and reflects the long-term pathway we continue to build at Total Tennis.

School Partnerships

School programs remain an important part of introducing young players to tennis and strengthening participation within Total Tennis.

Our **Floreat Primary School** Tuesday morning coaching program reached record participation this year, with more than **40 students** enrolled throughout the year.

At **Hale School**, additional tennis squads were introduced during the year, and we are currently working with the school to establish before-school tennis sessions for students in Years 1–5. These sessions are aimed at introducing younger students, many of whom are not already involved with another tennis club, to the game and providing another pathway into Total Tennis programs.

We are pleased to report that despite growing competition from new padel clubs opening across Perth, our club has continued to grow. It was a positive year, although we said goodbye to our much-loved Maria Costa and Matias Urbina. We warmly welcomed Santiago G (weekdays) and Santiago D (weekends) to the team, and we are currently in the process of renewing the contract of our Head Coach, Mauro Giovannone.

Court Usage Overview

Online bookings were the largest contributor, accounting for approximately 62% of all booked court hours. Our program offering has also expanded to include social padel sessions, social & coaching sessions, group coaching by level, and Intro to Padel sessions.
